## Penn State Colon and Rectal Surgeons Offer State-of-the-Art Services for IBD Surgery

We are proud to share with you the fact that our Colon and Rectal surgeons have been trained and are successfully utilizing the state of the art technology of the da Vinci® system which now is being used for IBD surgeries. The da Vinci® system makes fewer incisions, it utilizes 3D HD vision system and tiny wristed instruments that bend and rotate far greater than the human wrist.

These features enable surgeons to operate with enhanced vision, precision, and control. As a result the da Vinci® technology offers the following benefits: precise removal of tissue; low blood loss, quick return of bowel function, quick return to normal diet, low rate of complications, low rate of converting to open surgery compared to traditional laparoscopy; short hospital stay, small incisions for minimal scarring. Our surgeons appreciate how disruptive the need for surgery is to an individual's life, they are constantly striving to enhance services to improve the quality of life of every person affected by a colorectal illness.

**Golf Tournament to Benefit IBD**



The Penn National Golf Tournament has been a huge success in its fundraising efforts. Last year alone the event raised \$425,000. Over the past twenty years the Carlino fund has raised over \$3.4 million dollars to the fund. These funds have supported ground breaking IBD research here at Penn State Hershey. We have established one of the nation's largest IBD Biobank and Registry, which contains DNA, serum, and tissue specimens from multiple generations of over 2,300 IBD patients for genetic investigation into the causes and improved treatment of IBD. The Carlino Fund has also supported our recently opened Penn State Hershey IBD Center at the Milton S. Hershey Medical Center. Our multi-disciplinary center is the only one of its kind in the region where patients receive coordinated care from a team of internationally – recognized IBD experts in a single visit, allowing for the best and most advanced treatment options for IBD patients.
